E. BARTLETT BROOKS

Evans Bartlett "Bart" Brooks was born 28 January 1900, in New Albany, Indiana, and graduated from High School there. He took an Indiana University extension course in business, and in 1922 set up his first business — a stationery store in Indianapolis. In 1926 he married his wife, Margaret, and took a position with Del Engraving Company in Muncie, Indiana, where he worked until 1930. He then moved to Dayton, where, in 1931, with Charles Ditzel, formed the Ditzel-Brooks Company. Two

years later, the Wayne Color Plate Company was formed, with Bart as Vice President and Secretary. He became owner and President in 1937, and remained in that position until selling the company in 1984.

He was also Vice President and Treasurer of the Brooks Investment Company from 1953 to 1984.

He joined the Engineers Club in 1934, and remained a member until his death, November 30, 1990. He was an active member of many area organizations, having served them as follows:

He also received the first Senior Citizen Gold Watch Award for outstanding public service in 1984.
